About the County

Tulare County is home to many scenic wonders, such as Sequoia and Kings Canyon national parks, that offer year-round recreational activities. With a population of over 442,179 (2010 Census), it is the second-leading producer of agricultural commodities in the United States, and its strategic location and valuable tax incentives make this area a desirable distribution point for many major corporations. The county seat belongs to Visalia which is the 5th largest city in the San Joaquin Valley. Visalia serves as the economic and governmental center to one of the most productive single agricultural counties in the country. The county is named for Tulare Lake, once the largest freshwater lake west of the Great Lakes. Drained for agricultural development, the site is now in Kings County, which was created in 1893 from the western portion of the formerly larger Tulare County.
